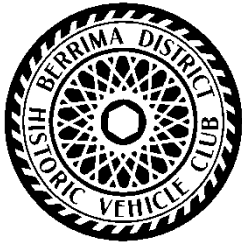

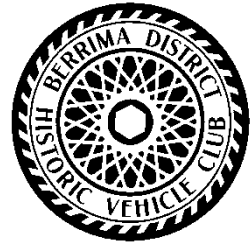

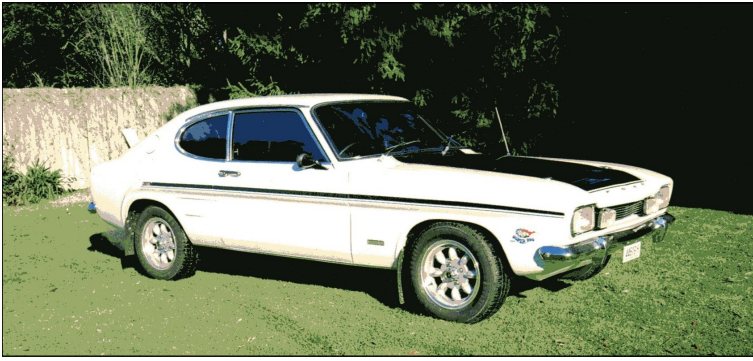

OUR 1972 FORD V6 CAPRI GT



After selling our much loved 39 FORD we decided to go on the look-out for a replacement just not so old. We looked on ebay, car point ,etc etc and put the WORD out. Chris mentioned that he had a mate in Tasmania who had a V6 Capri that may be of interest. He organised a road test when he was at TARGA of TASSIE.

Report came back positive so we made arrangements to fly down WED 1st FEB 2012.

Our adventure started when we went to Sydney on the Tuesday and spent the night at Formula One Airport motel. It absolutely bucketed down with rain all arvo and night. Went to bed (in our shoe box) about 9pm and of course had to get up at 12.30 pm due to air-conditioning dramas. Next came sirens a voice over loud speakers telling us to evacuate due fire in motel. Luckily this all turned out to be a false alarm - some guest had steamed up their bathroom. Not great sleep I must say. Anyway, we flew out with Virgin airlines the next morning-45 minutes late but a great flight.

The current owner of Capri drove 1 1/2 hrs to meet us at Launceston airport. He took us back to Lietinna near Scottsdale to check out car. Tubby was his name he also had a Lotus Cortina a Cortina 500 GT and a look-a- like XW GT Falcon. We did a road test paid and headed to Launceston. Just happened to be pulled over by the Police on the way wanting to see permit /License etc. Sandra mentioned that we were lost. He kindly asked us where we were heading. He ended up escorting us to our motel. You do not receive that attention in NSW.

Next morning we set off for Devonport car going well. We arrived and found our motel and checked out the town. Definitely a beautiful spot and Tasmanians are very friendly. Friday we were on our way home, we lined up and drove onto the Spirit of Tassie. Found our cabin and had fantastic dinner at the Captains FOOD Stall. The trip across the strait was as smooth as a baby's bottom. Charged up GPS all ready for disembarkment, could not wait. We did not sleep well on the boat, Sandra somehow injured her leg on a large step up into bathroom.

We docked at 5.30am Saturday morning had breakfast and drove off at 7.30am. There's no doubt about GPS-it was great, we were out of Melbourne in no time. Stopped for a cuppa and fuel at Seymour. All was going well until nearing Holbrook. Sandra thought she could hear a noise coming from engine. Stopped to check either alternator or water pump. Limped into Holbrook pulled into service station. The alternator pulley turned on shaft nut not tight enough. Worn shaft and pulley. Finally got hold of NRMA, but they could not help. A XR6 Ute drove into servo for a drink and the NRMA man said "grab him" he is an old ford man. I approached him. Would you believe it, he use to own a Capri but did not have an alternator, he did have a workshop across the road and he welded pulley to shaft, fitted alternator and we arrived home at 5.30 pm. Slept well Sat night.

By Monday I made a list of jobs that were required to get car into shape.

The engine had just been reconditioned only done 30 miles when we picked it up. Gearbox ok, diff a bit noisy so work began. When completed to my liking we registered it on club plates. 1st run to dam for morning tea. Felt good, nice to drive, everything ok. We then went off to Wagga rally. Checked fuel consumption got 40 miles to gallon going, 30 coming home pushed a bit harder. All in all very pleased with the car thanks Chris for your help.

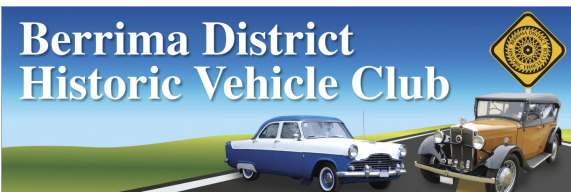

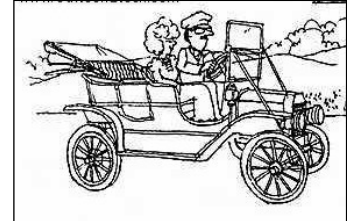


